Dear Brothers and Sisters!

It is a great honor to be here with you today. And I will, first of all, have to say two words on this special occasion: "Thank you" and "congratulation". My thanks go to Mar Mathew Arackal - for his brotherly love and deep friendship with the Diocese of Eisenstadt and the diocesan partnership we have. And my congratulations go to Mar Jose Pulickal who today is making an important step in his life.

The act of inauguration of a new bishop is a very special moment in the life of a diocese. It is the moment in which the pastor steps beside his herd to assume full responsibility. It is the moment to say, with the words of Pope Francis, to one's brothers and sisters: From now on I will dedicate my life to everyone of you. I will go ahead of you to lead your way. Bishop Mar Matthew Arackal, with a strong heart and a strong and skillful hand, has not only dedicated himself to the well-being of this diocese but has also gained outstanding achievements in strengthening relations with friends and partners in the

diocese of Eisenstadt. His many ideas, projects, and visits helped to widen and to deepen a partnership that had been begun by Archbishop Powathil and Bishop Stefan László, first bishop of our diocese, and carried forward by Mar Mathew Vattakuzhy and Bishop Paul Iby. I am deeply convinced that Bishop Mar Jose Pulickal, with his very own talents and charisma will carry forward not only the Eparchy of Kanjirapally but also our fruitful partnership strengthening it especially on the spiritual level.

He treated them free of charge, and as well as the physical health of his patients, Ladislaus was also concerned with their spiritual health. As a doctor, husband, and family father blessed Ladislaus was convinced that as the medical surgery was his domain, he was still an instrument in God's hands, and that the healing itself was a gift of God.

May our gift, the relic of Blessed Ladislaus, express our joy and our pride to be with you on this very special occasion. May our gift be seen as a further sign of brotherly love and deep friendship beetween the Diocese of Kanjirapally and the Diocese of Eisenstadt, and between their bishops. And may it always remind us, as Christians, what it takes to be a true follower of our Lord – a strong hand for shaping the world, but at the same time a strong heart opening for God and His plans. It would be a wonderful expression of our spiritual relationship if the relics could find a suitable place in Kanjirapally's cathedral.

Invoking the Lord's blessings upon your new service, Pulickal Pithave, upon your new period of life, Arackal Pithave, and upon you all, I shall say "Thank you!" and "All the best!"
